## St Margaret's Children and Family Care Society

Which supports some of Scotland's most vulnerable children, is hosting a 'Virtual Crib' this Advent. The charity could lose up to £100k in donations made by the Catholic community to its annual Crib Appeal collection boxes as congregation sizes remain limited due to Covid19.

St Margaret's which is in the trust of the Archdiocese of Glasgow and dioceses of Motherwell, Paisley and Galloway has the bishops of these dioceses as its President and Vice Presidents. For the past 65 years the small charity based in Glasgow which has placed well over 2,000 children with families.

Donations made to St Margaret's Children and Family Care Society, fund its Extended Post Adoption Support Services (EPASS). These services are available to any adopted child who may have experienced trauma and neglect and adoptive families across Scotland. The standard post adoption support is one year, St Margaret's offers EPASS services for life to those who need it, including home visits, therapeutic playgroups, teenagers groups, peer support groups and family events.

The Virtual Crib will be on St Margaret's website from Sunday 29 November until the Feast of the Epiphany on 6 January. The Virtual Crib is a peaceful, animated crib scene accompanied by a full Christmas Carol Concert from the St Andrew's Cathedral Choir. Viewers will also hear a specially recorded version of 'Oh Holy Night' sung by St Andrew's Choir Director and St Margaret's Origins Worker, Maria Madden. Visitors to the St Margaret's Virtual Crib will be able to read messages from some of the families supported this year and donate on the website page or alternatively can post a cheque to the charity's office at 26 Newton Place, Glasgow, G3 7PY.

# Some fabric planning for the New Year

I propose in the New Year to remove the cry chapels from Sacred Heart Church. I think this will help improve the feeling walking into the Church, creating a sense of space and I suspect we will frown on small unventilated spaces for a while yet. We can replace the pews at the back of the church and not loose spaces. I am they were liked for conscious the immediacy of the sound but with some work we can improve the sound in the Church and provide better sound in the porch if someone feels the need to leave the body of the church with a child in distress.

I have started some discussions regarding the pipe organ in Sacred Heart but the cost of necessary repairs for it to be useable will be beyond us. I hope to place an electric organ in the choir loft to remove it from the front of the church.

In St Gerard's Church the ceiling is in need of some repair and this may be a more major project given its age that will require its replacement and will take a bit longer to accomplish.

I have spoken to the diocese about some major cracks on the hall at Sacred Heart which are a cause of concern. We will wait on a structural report in the new year and keep you informed on the progress.
