Parish Finance Meeting

Following our January meeting a group has volunteered to look at parish finances, including fundraising, increased giving and gift-aid. I invite those interested to meet on Wednesday 23rd February in St Gerard's hall at 7.00pm.

Collections & Contactless Donations

One topic of conversation at the parish meeting was the possibility of accepting contactless donations for the parish. It is possible to buy a machine to accept contactless donations where people can choose how much they want to donate and if they want to gift-aid it, all done from a simple touchscreen device. In a world where fewer people use cash is this worth considering? Fr Stuart would like to know if this option would appeal to you?

Fabric Issues

We are still waiting on quotes for the work in St Gerard's which means we will not be able to get Diocesan approval for the work until the next Fabric and Finance meetings on 8th March.

We have appointed Gordon Harrison Architects to investigate the issues and provide options for Sacred Heart Church, Hall and House. They hope to provide options and costings by the end of March. They will provide an initial survey, drawings, specifications, costings and investigate planning and building warrants for a fixed cost of £4500. I worked with the Architects on a survey of the college in Rome.

Meanwhile we will arrange a full asbestos survey of the 6 parish buildings.

Pastoral Letter to the Catholics of Scotland On the Restoration of the Mass Obligation in the Dioceses of Scotland

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

The obligation for Catholics to celebrate Sunday as a Holy Day by gathering together for Mass will be restored from the First Sunday in Lent, Sunday 6th March.

Given the easing of restrictions in every other walk of life, the Church looks forward to welcoming Catholics back to Holy Mass. As always, the obligation does not apply to those who are sick and their carers or to those aware of their greater vulnerability to the virus. May the continuing recovery of our country bring new hope to us all especially those who are ill, those who mourn loved ones, those who are apprehensive and those who have sustained us in so many ways throughout the Pandemic.

We, the Bishops of Scotland, take this opportunity to thank our clergy and our parish volunteers for all their efforts. May our Lenten journey this year lead us to a renewed appreciation of our Catholic faith, of the celebration of the Eucharist and of the presence of the Risen Christ who is always at our side.
