

History of St Gerard's Church

St Gerard's Roman Catholic Church was opened on Fleming Road on Sunday 13th June 1971 by Bishop Francis Thomson, the third Bishop of Motherwell. The new church replaced the original church in the old Noble School where the parish had been based since its founding in 1967.

The parish was established on the Ist September 1967, as a daughter parish of Sacred Heart Parish which had been founded in 1949, to serve the growing population of the North Road and Hattonrigg area. Being close, at that time, to

one of the finest maternity hospitals in the country, the naw parish was dedicated to St. Gerard Majella, patron of expectant mothers.

While awaiting construction of the Church, the parish was given the use of the former Noble School, situated then to the right of the west end of Lynnburn Avenue, in the North Road, Bellshill where three classrooms were converted into a temporary Church with the remaining premises serving the usual parish activities.

Construction of the new Church building began in December 1969 on the present site in the heart of the Shirrel housing estate and was completed in May 1971. Father Patrick Moss, the founding parish priest of St. Gerard's, initially lived in a council house in Mavisbank Gardens until the Presbytery was completed. One of his first functions was to form a Parish Council whose primary aim was to help raise funds to clear the cost of the new Church and Presbytery, costing at that time in the region of £ 100,000.

Two years after the opening of the Church, St Gerard's Primary School was opened next door, on the ground to the north of the Church in August 1973.

During Father Patrick O'Hare's time in St. Gerard's the Parish Hall was built and opened for use. It was also during Father O'Hare's time that the first Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist were commissioned and lay readers introduced.

Father Timothy Brosnan arrived in St. Gerard's on 21st October 1984, remaining for 27 years until 2011 making him the longest serving parish priest of the parish.

Just two years after his arrival, the year 1986 saw extensive damage done to the Church when, on the 16th May, the Sanctuary was completely destroyed by fire. The Church was closed for repair for several months with Mass being said for parishioners in St. Gerard's Primary School on Sundays and in the parish hall on weekdays. The

Church was reopened in time for Christmas 1986.

On 26th June 1998, the first, and only, priestly ordination took place in St Gerard's Church when son of the parish, Father Stephen Rooney, was ordained by Bishop Joseph Devine.

It was announced in September 2013 that with Father Kevin McGoldrick to succeed Father Michael Brown as parish priest of St Gerard's, the parish was to share a parish priest with Sacred Heart Parish and the two parishes would be linked. In 2018 the two parishes were formally amalgamated to create the new parish of Sacred Heart and St Gerard.

Following his Installation as the fifth Bishop of Motherwell on 23rd June 2014, Bishop Joseph Toal took up residence in St Gerard's Presbytery. He remained in the parish for ten years, the second longest member of clergy to live at St Gerard's after Canon Brosnan. In January 2024, Bishop Toal took up residence in the Cathedral House, Motherwell.



Final Vows of Sister Stacey Cameron

On 25th March 2017, Sister Stacey Cameron made her final profession of vows as a Religious Sister of St Peter Claver in St Gerard's Church. Sister Stacey made her solemn profession as a member of the Redemptoristine Nuns in Dublin on 11th November 2023 taking the name Sister Angela.

On Sunday 13th June 2021, Bishop Toal and Father Stuart Parkes celebrated a Mass of Thanksgiving to mark the Golden Jubilee of

the opening of St Gerard's Church. Due to covid-19 restrictions in place at the time, the celebrations were much simpler and only a small number of parishioners were able to be present at the Mass.












